



# **Student Support Highlights**

The Associates and Young Associates continue to turn dreams into reality by opening doors to a brighter future and expanding access to post-secondary education. Your generosity and continued engagement make it possible to offer an exceptional student experience that empowers future-ready leaders.

The **Price Student-Managed Investment Fund** marked a major milestone in June with its first AGM, uniting students, alumni, and industry leaders to celebrate the power of experiential learning in Asper. As of April 30, 2025, the portfolio held just **over \$2.4 million in assets** and delivered an impressive **11.1% return**.

The 2024/25 <u>Case Competition Season</u> saw **263** undergraduate and graduate students compete in 38 events, earning an impressive **28 podium placements**, including **10 first-place wins**. Fuelled by a **record-breaking 474 volunteers**, the season pulsed with energy and connection.

The **58th annual Commerce Students' Association (CSA) Business Banquet** welcomed over 300 guests, including 100 corporate representatives from more than 30 businesses. Centered around the theme *Illuminate*, the evening featured **keynote speaker Alex Streltsov**, General Manager and CEO of Prolex Media, who shared his inspiring journey from immigrating to Canada from Ukraine to launching a successful creative agency.

# **Asper Career Development Centre**

Thanks to the generous support of The Associates and Young Associates, the Asper Career Development Centre continues to champion student success and empowers students to boldly shape and strengthen communities across Manitoba and around the world. Accredited by CEWIL Canada, the I.H. Asper School of Business Co-op Program is the largest business co-op program in the province. We're proud to share that the program has been **re-accredited by CEWIL Canada through 2030**, a recognition of our commitment to the highest national standards in co-operative education.

In 2024/25, the Asper Co-op Program placed 355 students—including 339 Bachelor of Commerce students and 16 graduate students. According to the 2024 Asper Employment Report, 90% of Bachelor of Commerce graduates are employed full-time in Manitoba, and 95% of co-op students secured full-time employment within three months of graduation.

#### 17th Annual Celebrating Co-op Awards

On January 30, 2025, the 2024 Celebrating Co-op Awards welcomed students and employer partners to reflect on another incredible year of co-op education. The 2024 Co-op Student of the Year was **Priyansh Modi**, and the 2024 Co-op Employer of the Year was **Treaty One Nations Inc.** (pictured above). **Treaty One Development Corporation CEO Kathleen BlueSky [MBA/15]** was also recognized by AACSB International, the world's largest business education association, as part of its 2025 Class of Influential Leaders.

# **Stu Clark New Venture Championships**

Big ideas can change the world. The 2025 Stu Clark New Venture Championships once again showcased the transformative imagination of entrepreneurship and the impact of experiential learning for students. Thirty-two teams from across Canada tackled real-world challenges with bold, market-ready solutions. **Imagine Devices Inc.**, representing the University of Texas, impressed judges with Trinity Tube, a multifunctional infant feeding device, earning first place in the Graduate category. **Xatoms**, from the University of Toronto, won the Undergraduate category with a water purification system capable of tackling water crises in off-grid or resource-limited communities.

Faculty of Science students **Devon Bath and Naim Ben Younes** (pictured above) spoke with <u>CBC Radio</u> about **GradFinder**, their Al-powered platform connecting graduate students with professors, and the valuable judge feedback they'll use to grow it.

### **Asper Business Case Competition**

The third annual Asper Business Case Competition (February 2025) challenged nine graduate teams to apply their strategic insights to three comprehensive cases: from bringing travelling exhibitions to the Manitoba Museum and identifying the next blue ocean market for Arow Global Ltd., to building trust in evolving techology at People Corporation. Memorial University took home first place after a stellar performance throughout the competition, with John Molson School of Business coming in second place, and DeGroote School of Business rounding out the podium in third.

#### **Jeux du Commerce West Competition (JDC West)**

Team Asper, made up of 46 BComm students, placed **first** in the finance competition (and skit night), and earned **third** in debate, operations management, and not-for-profit. **Evan Adair**, one of the team captains, explained how the year-long process of preparing for JDC West went well beyond academics.



"The thing that defines JDC West for me is

the community. Obviously, we take the academic portions very seriously—we have rigorous training, plenty of workshops throughout the year, and very qualified coaches and industry experts. But JDC is also so much more. Our team logged a total of **over 2,200 volunteer hours** before the competition, partnering with six local charities," he said.

These organizations included Harvest Manitoba, Koats for Kids, and the Make-A-Wish Foundation. Fellow Team Asper captain **Grace Cook** said the results were thrilling, but it was the team's growth that truly stood out:

"A lot of students on the team had no case experience when we started, and seeing all those students giving killer presentations and showcasing so much knowledge in their fields was such a highlight."

#### **MBA Games**

At the graduate level, a small but mighty Stu Clark Graduate School team finished third overall in the annual MBA Games, a competition of academics, athletics, and spirit. Much like JDC West, the MBA Games features a charitable component, with Team Asper raising over \$29,000 for Canada Learning Code, a national not-for-profit that empowers individuals with tech skills to navigate their careers with confidence.



Team Asper finished **second** in the Canada Learning Code Case Competition (Bamibo Isichei, Sharib Jalis, Sravani Kalva). Team captain Oluwagbotemi Dada reflected on the team's historic performance:

"This is the **first time** that Asper achieved a podium finish in the MBA Games, which is super impressive considering that we were the smallest team there with **only 15 members**."

#### **International Distinguished Entrepreneur Award (IDEA)**

**NFL legend Steve Young** inspired 475 attendees—including 185 rural high school students—at the <u>IDEATE Student Presentation</u> held at the new Desautels Concert Hall. Focusing on accountability and growth, Steve encouraged students to "be vulnerable." He shared, "When I finally realized that all the mistakes on the field were rooted in my error, not someone else's, was the most powerful thing I could do to lead, and I just encourage them to be vulnerable."

#### **IGNITE Award**

At the <u>IGNITE 2025 Gala</u>, **Gail Asper** [BA/81, LLB/84, LLD/08] was honoured for her visionary leadership and decades of philanthropy. Addressing a record audience of over 850 guests, including 410 new Asper students, she opened with heartfelt reflections on her father Dr. Israel "Izzy" Harold Asper, "He was a very proud prairie boy who believed you can accomplish anything in Manitoba." Gail stressed the importance of "simply showing up" at events like IGNITE, where you can meet future mentors and make lifelong connections. She reminded students that trying their best is what matters, and failure is okay—it helps you grow.

# **Faculty Excellence**

#### The Associates Achievement Awards

The annual Associates Achievement Awards Celebration honours excellence in research, teaching, and engagement at the I.H. Asper School of Business. In November 2024, four new Associates Fellows were named—Shiu-Yik Au (Finance), Narendra Malalgoda (Supply Chain Management), Kiran Pedada (Marketing and Inclusive Business), and Wei Wang (Leadership and Ethics). In addition to awarding multi-year research fellowships, The Associates also generously recognize excellence in the classroom with the Associates Teaching Awards, valued at \$5,000 each. Sean Buchanan and Dan Shin received the 2024 Associates Teaching Awards.

   Awarded Best Paper at Oxford's Global Conference on Caste, Business, and Society for research on caste-based homophily and value delivery in resource-constrained environments; presented related work at UC Berkeley's Haas School of Business.

  Business Ethics scholars to speak at the biennial UMass Amherst Business Ethics
  Conference and co-organized the inaugural Asper International Behavioural
  Management Conference as co-director of the new <u>David Dreman Behavioural</u>
  Management Lab.
